



WARNING: When using a cut-off wheel, please be aware of the possibilities of hazards that may exist for operators and bystanders. Using proper tool guards, protective equipment and clothing can prevent bodily injuries. Dust and sparks can also cause injury. Wear a NIOSH approved respirator and be sure the cut-off wheels comply with ANSI B7.1.

WHEN USING CUT-OFF WHEELS:

1. Never bend or twist cut-off wheels. Do not jam the wheel onto the surface causing the motor to slow or stall.
2. Use only edge surfaces of the cut-off wheel.
3. Operate the tool directing the wheel away from your body before starting the cut.
4. Engage the wheel gradually onto the work surface.
5. Always wear protective clothing, including full face shield, respirator and OSHA certified goggles.
6. Do not exceed the **RPM** speed rating printed on the label of the wheel.

MOUNTED CUT-OFF WHEELS:

1. Always use a wheel guard on the tool when possible and be sure that the guard is in good working condition.
2. Never use wheels that are damaged, unlabeled or have been dropped.
3. Do not force a wheel onto the spindle or alter the hole (arbor) on the wheel.
4. Fasten the nut firmly on the spindle, but do not over tighten.
5. Do not use a tool that exceeds the **RPM** rating printed on the labels on the wheel you are using.
6. Make sure the flange is clean, flat and at least ¼ the wheel diameter.
7. Stand clear of sparks and flying debris.
